### Mission Statement

The Inter-Group Representative's

Primary Purpose is to be the conveyance of their group's conscience pertaining to the North Central Ohio Alcoholics Anonymous, Inc. Inter-Group Office, to supply their group with the information obtained at their monthly meetings, to vote in the elections of the members our Advisory Committee, who will in turn oversee the Operations of North Central Ohio Alcoholics Anonymous Inter-Group Office.

### What Do IGRs Do?

The duties of the Inter-Group Representative include, but are not limited to the following:

1. Attending the regularly scheduled monthly Advisory Committee Meetings.
2. Reporting the results of these meetings to their home-groups.
3. Keeping the Inter-Group Office staff informed of any changes to home-group meeting times & places, and special conditions for up-dating of the NCOAA Meeting Schedule Booklet.
4. Urging home-group participation at NCOAA Inter-Group functions.
5. Keeping your home-group informed of published announcements about AA recovery activities.
6. Personally observe the Twelve Traditions and ensure that your home-group observes those Traditions.

Remember, this list is only a few ideas. The Inter-Group Representative can be creative when seeking service opportunities.

### When Do IGRs Meet?

IGRs meet, to become the governing body of the NCOAA Inter-Group Advisory Committee, on the first Saturday of every month at 11:00 A.M. in the Old Rec. Center (O Cottage) of the OVH. It is located at 3416 Columbus Ave., Sandusky, Ohio, 44870.

### How Do I Become an IGR?

Each IGR is elected by their home-group. The standard term for an IGR is one or two years. The IGR candidate should have a minimum of one year continuous sobriety. These, however, are only suggested guidelines. The group's conscience is the final authority. Any recovering alcoholic who wishes to enhance their sobriety and serve this fellowship is welcome. They will play a major role in contributing to the welfare of the NCOAA Inter-Group Office and to the NCOAA fellowship as a whole.
